INTRODUCTION:

Julius Caesar won an important battle, and when asked how it went, he replied with the famous, "Veni, vidi, vici!" -- in English: "I came, I saw, I conquered." How much more does this concept apply to the Lord Jesus Christ?!! At this Christmas season we are focusing on the first part, Jesus came into the world.
